

Modern Slavery Statement

As a company Jackson are committed to understanding and minimising the risks of modern day slavery. This Statement is made pursuant to Section 54(1) of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 for the financial year ending 31st December 2022 and outlines both the steps Jackson have taken so far and will take to ensure that slavery and human trafficking do not occur either within our own business or our supply chains.

Company Structure:

Jackson Civil Engineering Group Ltd, incorporating Jackson Civils Ltd and Jackson Frameworks Ltd, is a civil engineering contractor which operates throughout most of England and is part of One Group Construction Ltd. Our procurement activities take place in England our supply chain partners are predominantly UK and EU based.

Jackson's anti-slavery initiatives are led by the board directors and senior management.

Company Policy:

Our Modern Slavery Policy can be found in CP 301.21 Sustainability Code – People

Risk Assessment:

We have assessed and identified the high risk areas within our business and supply chain and have developed and action plan to address these. This includes using only approved supply chain partners and standardised sourcing of high risk materials from Supply Chain with SA8000 certification or similar.

Our approach this year:

Following on from the work in previous years we have continued to provide material on the subject of Modern Day Slavery to all sites.

We have also continued to update our internal SharePoint page to disseminate resources related to Modern Slavery to all Jackson employees and this year we have started to develop a dedicated area to share resources externally with our supply chain.

A further questionnaire was sent to supply chain partners to better understand how they are managing the risk of modern slavery and ensure that they are conforming to our requirements.

In 2022 we also continued to monitor progress against the People Matter Charter to further show our commitment and develop our strategy to tackling modern slavery.

What we will do next:

During 2023 we will continue to review the steps we have already taken and monitor their effectiveness. We will also provide further awareness training on modern slavery to the QHSE team to assist them in spotting potential signs during their regular inspections.

We will continue to ensure that all new starters to the business complete our internal Modern Slavery Awareness training.

We will continue to use the guidance provided in the People Matter Charter to develop our approach and we will also continue work to increase awareness further amongst our employees and supply chain using resources available to us through the Supply Chain Sustainability School.
